Children need healthy meals to learn. **Higley Unified School District** offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs ES-\$2.10, MS-\$2.15, HS-\$2.20; lunch costs ES \$3.25, MS -\$3.65, H-\$3.80. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced-price meals. Reduced-price is \$0.00 for breakfast and \$0.00 for lunch due to a State-Approved Subsidy. This packet includes a school meal application for free or reduced-price meal benefits and application directions. <u>WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR FREE MEALS</u>? All children in households receiving benefits from **SNAP**, **FDPIR**, **TANF** or **DC-M Free** can get free meals regardless of your income. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILDREN QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY? Do the members of your household lack a permanent address? Are you staying together in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing arrangement? Does your family relocate on a seasonal basis? Are any children living with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household? If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and haven't been told your children will get free meals, please complete an application and select the appropriate box.

<u>MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT ANOTHER ONE?</u> Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year through 8/27/2025. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year. If you do not send in a new application that is approved by the school or you have not been notified that your child is eligible for free meals, your child will be charged the full price for meals.

I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILD(REN) GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Please fill out an application.
